

CDBG PROCESS

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

- Allocations distributed annually by the Governor's Office on Economic Development to:
 - 15 Rural counties
 - 11 Rural incorporated cities
 - Approximately \$2.8 million

Unincorporated Washoe County Projects



HUD Program Outcomes

Develop viable communities by meeting the objectives of:

- ✓ Expanding economic opportunities
- ✓ Providing suitable living environment
- ✓ Providing decent housing



CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The HCD Act requires that CDBG-funded activities <u>meet one</u> of the following three national objectives:

	National Objectives
#1	Benefit 51% or more LMI persons
#2	Aid in the prevention or elimination of slum or blight
#3	Address a <u>recent</u> <u>urgent</u> community development need



AREA BENEFIT (LMI-A)

Activity benefits available to all residents in a particular area [see 24 CFR 570.483(b)(1)]:

- Must be the entire area served by activity;
- At least 51% of area residents must be LMI;
- Area served must be primarily residential.

LMI documentation for 51% or greater by:

- HUD provided data---Census data/LMI levels, or
- 2) Income survey data (HUD Notice CPD-05-06)
 - Local applicant defines service area and state provides approval.



LIMITED CLIENTELE (LMI-C)

Activity may Benefit a limited clientele, per HUD regulation (24 CFR 570.483(b)(2):

Activity may benefit at least one of eight categories of generally presumed principally LMI persons:

- 1) Children who are abused
- 2) People who are homeless
- 3) Adults who are severely disabled
- 4) Spouses who are battered
- 5) People who are elderly
- 6) Adults who are illiterate
- 7) People living with AIDS
- 8) Farm workers who are migrant



ACTIVITY FUNDABILITY

For a project to be <u>fundable</u> it must pass <u>two</u> tests:

- > Must meet a National Objective and
- ➤ Must have an Eligible Activity

PUBLIC FACILITIES

<u>Eligible activities</u> include the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehab or installation of public facilities and improvements, including:

- Infrastructure Improvements (Construction and installation)
- Neighborhood Facilities (Parks, playgrounds)
- ADA Accessibility



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Eligible activities include:

- The acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehab or installation of commercial or industrial buildings, structures or other real property, equipment and/or improvements
- Assisting a private, for-profit business, including micro-enterprise assistance
- Providing economic development services in connection with CDBG eligible ED activities
- Job training, placement, or other types of service (public service or ED)
- Rehabilitation of publicly and privately owned commercial structures



Planning & Capacity Building

- Plans to assist in determining community needs.
- Plans related to implementing a CDBG-assisted project.

All planning grants must lead to a project.





Eligible Projects

Examples of <u>eligible</u> projects:

- Water, wastewater and storm drain design and construction
- Streets, roads and sidewalks
- Fire stations
- Community, senior and youth centers
- Emergency vehicles/equipment
- Planning
- Downtown revitalization
- Libraries
- Landfills
- Assisted living facilities
- Substance abuse centers
- Handicapped access



WASHOE CDBG PAST PROJECTS

Washoe County has participated in the State CDBG program since 1982.

- Implemented 55 grant projects
- Total funding amount of \$5,298,832
- Public Facility projects 30
- Planning Projects 12
- Housing Rehabilitation projects 2
- Public service projects 11

Washoe County Applicant and Sponsor

- Non-profit entities
- Other governmental entries (GIDs, etc.)
- For Profit entities

Applications through ZoomGrants

Maximum of two County and two nonprofit/community applications

Intent to Apply – DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 26, 2023

- Economic Development Projects must submit CDBG Impact Analysis Matrix DEADLINE: September 30, 2023
- Zoom Grants Account Set-up Required

- Environmental Review
- Maintain Records on Beneficiaries
- Verify Income Eligibility
- Federal Procurement Standards
- Labor Standards and Wage Monitoring
- Reporting, Reporting, Reporting....
