TMPF and RDGA have the common vision to

enrich our community lives through our local parks and open space

TMPF has a broad mission:

Protecting & enhancing our communities' livability through public engagement, education, and the sustainability of our parks, open spaces, and trails.

RDGA has a focused mission:

Promote amateur disc golf and provide maintenance and support of our parks and free public disc golf courses throughout the Northern Nevada.



TMPF and RDGA each bring different tools and experience to provide a more robust program to support the facilities and satisfy the need of the property owners.

TMPF, formed in 2012, is a larger more formal organization and brings:

existing relationships, volunteer event coordination experience, safety, insurance coverage,

and knowledge and skills for preservation and protection of natural resources.

RDGA, formed in 2008, is a smaller organization born by Washoe request and brings:

existing contributions*, course design and construction experience (all local courses),
dedicated funding, membership base, regional contacts, tools, materials, event hosting, disc
golf education, existing weekly activity and fundraising framework



DGCSP functions under Owner oversight through these primary paths.

On-Going Upkeep and Maintenance

- small team throughout the year to maintain and repair the existing facilities, equipment, and trails
- monitoring, reporting, notification, request, and approval coordinated with facility owner
- Common activities include repair of vandalism, weed mowing, clean-up, fixing benches and signs

Projects for Improvements, Modification, and New Construction

- significant changes to existing facilities which commonly require additional volunteer labor
- proposals, requirements, approvals, planning and budgeting, coordination as needed
- Adding holes or features, changed use area, landscaping and earthwork, trails

Owner Flow-Down

Owner notifications, concerns, or needed actions to the DGCSP



Washoe County Parks and Open Space includes 3 facilities within the DGCSP scope.

Rancho San Rafael Regional Park: "The Ranch" est. 2008

19 holes, 2008, moderate difficulty, UDisc rating 4.0

Sun Valley Regional Park: "Lizard Peak" est. 2014

- 9 holes, "Pitch & Putt", easy difficulty, UDisc rating: 4.1
- 27 holes, Main Course, challenging, UDisc rating: 4.2

South Valleys Regional Park: "The Wedge" est. 2016

• 9 holes, easy to moderate difficulty, UDisc rating 4.0

Note "contribution" from slide 3: The entirety of these courses has been funded, built, and maintained by the RDGA and its membership since established.



Disc Golf Course Statistics *course data from UDisc mobile phone scoring app annual report

Global course growth: over 10% course growth per year for 5 years (2 to 3 new courses a day)

Courses Per Capita: 1 course per approx 100,000 people in the greater Reno Sparks

Nevada ranks 46th nationally per capita with 38 courses total. Similarly sized states shown below.

- First course on City of Reno property, "Mayors Park" in Stead, built in 2021
- 10,000+ courses in the US, 15,000+ courses in the world and growing rapidly

RDGA Membership: ~150 members players who pay an annual membership

Disc Golf Course and User Statistics *raw data provided by the UDisc mobile phone scoring app

Rounds Played Annually: 50,000-80,000 rounds played on our courses annually

- 16,000 rounds <u>recorded</u> annually on the UDisc app for 4 years in a row
- bulk of players are casual and do not use the UDisc app
- 5:1 ratio projected and confirmed by survey *Dr. Brian Hartman, Professor of Statistics at BYU
- 3:1 (very conservative hedging) and 5:1 (projected) yields 50-80k rounds per year
- Averaged every course would have 2-4 players starting every hour all year
- An average round is 2-3 hours and 1.5 to 3 miles hiking
- Regional growth last 5 years
 - 2024 Washoe State Park rebuild
 - 2024 Kingvale II
 - 2023 Kingvale I
 - 2023 Liberty Pond Fallon
 - 2021 Paradise Park South Tahoe

- 2021 Portola River Course
- 2019 Skyline Susanville
- 2019 Carson Ridge
- 2018 Stampede
- 2018 Donner Ski Ranch
