SOUTH REGION HIGHLIGHTS

- The Gardening in Nevada Series hosted by Washoe County Extensions Master Gardeners was very well received at Bartley Ranch Regional Park. They were held every Tuesday evening in February and March and have an average attendance of over 30 participants.
- The Life and Times of Will James was held at Bartley Ranch Regional Park on February 15th. It highlighted the unusual path Will James took to build his legacy and legend in the Truckee Meadows and beyond and was attended by 150 of his devoted fans.
- The Astronomical Society of Nevada invited interested individuals to view the night skies at Galena Creek Regional Park on February 28th and was enjoyed by 40 attendees.
- On March 1st Park Rangers held a Junior Ranger "Snow Day" and taught 30 young explorers how to prepare for and adventure in the snow at Galena Creek Regional Park.

- Another well attended Wildlife Wednesday, featuring "Birds of Prey" was held at Lazy 5 Regional Park on March 12th.
- Junior Ranger Adventure Day was held at Lazy 5 Regional Park on Saturday, March 15th, focusing on animal migrations.
- Washoe County Juvenile Services Youth Employment Program worked with rangers to complete a beautification project, including murals and areas for the public to create "chalk art" at the Lazy 5 Skate Park over spring break.
- Recent training attended by North Region staff include OSHA-10 in February, Park Rangers Association of California Training Conference held in Reno in late March, and the upcoming Ranger Excellence School in Estes Park, Colorado in May.

NORTH REGION UPCOMING EVENTS

- Peavine District rangers will team up with volunteers from the Lahontan Autobahn Society to complete a cleanup of the Swan Lake Nature Study Area on April 12th.
- The annual Farm Day Celebration will take place in the Nevada Farms and Families Area at Rancho San Rafael Regional Park on Saturday, April 26th.
- North Region staff will lead several volunteer projects as part of the annual KTMB Great Community Cleanup on Saturday, May 3rd from 8am – 12pm. North sites will include Rancho San Rafael, Swan Lake NSA and Lockwood Trailhead.
- Peavine District staff will host the second annual North Valleys Community Fair at the North Valleys Community Center on Saturday, May 17th from 10am-2pm. The fair will feature Washoe County services available to North Valleys residents, such as the Library, Human Services Agency, Sheriff's Office, as well as the Food Bank of Northern Nevada and the Washoe County School District.
- A Junior Ranger Adventure Day program will be held at Rancho San Rafael's Nevada Farms and Families Area on Sunday, May 18th, featuring Farm Animals.
