Arboretum Operations

- 2 dead tree removed. Cause of death was improper planting techniques from 40+ years ago. As well as numerous trees are being cleaned out of major dead branches.
- Supplemental watering on certain hot spots in the garden
- ♦ 1 Tree was planted in Burke to help maintain a beautiful spring blossom
- ◆ Accommodations are being made to ensure Artown Reno has a good venue
