a. Chair

Ed Atwell, UNR, nominated and moved to elect Ryan Sommers, North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District, as Chair; Member Sommers accepted the nomination. There were no further nominations or Committee discussions. There was no response to the call for public comment. Upon a call for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

b. Vice-Chair

Ed Atwell, UNR, nominated and moved to appoint Don Pelt, Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe, for the role of Vice-Chair. Member Pelt accepted the nomination. There were no further nominations or Committee discussions. There was no response to the call for public comment. Upon a call for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

6. NEVADA SHARED RADIO SYSTEM PROJECT UPDATE [Non-Action Item] – A presentation and discussion on the progress of the Nevada Share Radio System (NSRS) project status, cutover outlook, and possible prioritization for NSRS Regions and site builds. *Adrian Arnold NSRS System Administrator*

Adrian Arnold, NSRS System Administrator, shared Tracy Moore has completed his initial training with L3 Harris and is becoming actively engaged on customer service actions. He can be reached by email tracy.moore@l3harris.com.

The longstanding operational pause in regards to the execution of the P25 upgrade program with some caveats. They have remobilized and are conducting field work currently at numerous sites in the NSRS schedule.

Split-level of engagement with L3 Harris during and before the pause. L3 Harris has brought forward a set of requested concession items for cost avoidance or additional fee applied to the program for each of the three members. Discussions towards issue resolution have been ongoing and escalating and are now at the highest level of engagement. It is unknown if the high-level discussions will have major disruptive impacts on the execution of the remaining program work, but it is possible. The second level of engagement is the execution and management of the

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recommended field operations and actions to get Regions Two and Three built, tested and accepted. Previously the plan was to rearrange the site definition, the composition of Regions Two and Three in a way that would streamline the executability of the sequential actions based on the level of site readiness. Due to the amount of time that has since passed, a new proposition is to essentially have a continuous execution of all remaining site essentially combining the two Regions. With the new plan, Washoe County's acceptance would likely be in 2027 rather than 2026 while leaving the transition to the new system would remain the same.

It was clarified that the higher-level conversations between upper management and legal counsel are not public. And that discussions with the Committed could jeopardize before any concessions are at a point of being final. The three member agencies have agreed to align themselves shared and common position. Requests for more information could be submitted to Mr. Kobulic and DDA Carner with acknowledgement it would need to be an internal Washoe County determination of what is shareable.

There was extensive discussion of the BLM permitting process frustrations. Washoe County has begun working with third-party contractor to help move the process along, have list of studies that are required and underway. NDOT and Washoe County submitted at the same time requesting prioritization and while having provided additional funding, the process hasn't sped up as much as hoped.

Chair Sommers inquired if it would still be helpful to consider drafting a letter as discussed at a previous meeting and volunteered to work with Member Ketring and DDA Carner.
